

Regional Overview

Africa

The four chapters in this unit provide information on the geography, history, culture, government, and economics of selected African countries.



GEOGRAPHY

Savanna covers much of Africa, with rain forests located on the equator. The vast Sahara dominates northern Africa. The world's longest river, the Nile, flows through the northeast.



HISTORY

Great empires arose in Africa, including Egypt, Aksum, and Songhai. In the 18th and 19th centuries, European nations divided up most of Africa, creating colonies to enrich their own countries. African colonies began winning independence after World War II, but colonial history still affects Africa.

Africa is home to hundreds of ethnic groups and more than 1,000 languages. Major religions in Africa include Islam, Christianity, and traditional local faiths. Soccer is popular throughout the continent. Western and African cultures have affected each other, particularly in art and music.



GOVERNMENT

When African nations won independence, many kept the European colonial borders, leading some traditional ethnic enemies to clash. Some nations with young democracies are learning to share power among different groups.



ECONOMICS

Africa has potential for great wealth. But years of instability have made it hard for some countries to improve their economies. Other nations are working to help African economies, lending aid and trying to erase debt.




